In the Name of www.southcarolinalioneers net Burrows of South Carolina Planter, Being of Sound Mind and Memory, Yet Calling to mind the frailty of my Nature, do make and Ordain This my last Will and Testament in the manner and form Following, That is to Say-First, I Give and Recomend my Soul to God, who gave it, and my Body to the Earth to be Decently Interr'd at the Discretion of my Executors herein after named, and as touching Such Wordly Estate which It has pleased God to Blefs me with after all my Debts and Funeral Charges are paid, I will and Bequeath after the following Manner and form (Vis) Imprimis, I dive and Bequeath to my well Beloved Son William Burrows, five hundred acres of land lying on black Mingo Swamp, Sevinty acres of pine Land lying convenient to it and two hundred Acres of pine land lying Near Potatoe ferry on Black River---- Imprimis, I Give and Bequeath to my well beloved Son George Washington Burrows four Hundred and fifty acres of Land lying on Black mingo Swamp formerly Robt Coopers Land Two Hundred acres adjoining formerl Hugh Greggs and one Hundred and Sixty two acres pine Land Granted to myself --- And likewise my will and Desire is that al my Personal Estate that I am now or Shall hereafter be Pofefsed of Shall be Equally divided between my two Sons William and George, And in Case are a one of them Should die Before they Marry or Come of Age, hos Part Shall go to the Other, and if Both Should die Before They come of age it Shall go to the next nearest of Kin, and I do hereby revoke and Disannull all Forme? Wills and Testaments Confirming This and no other to be my Last Will and Testament --- And Lastly I do make and Constitute my Eldest Son William BurrowsCharles Williams, George McCutchin and John Gamble, Executors of this my last Will and Testament-In witness Whereof I hereunto Set my hand and Seal This 5 day of July 1797. Signed Sealed Published and Pronounces in presence of us & Inpresence of Each of us one of the Other
