It is my desire that all my lawful debts be paid----Item: I lend unto my beloved wife Sevil Graham the plantation or Tract of Land that I now live on the Land is as follows, there is two Two plats, each containing 100 acres- & 100 acres to be taken out of the large survey adjoining to the plantatio/ I now live on or the above mentioned two hundred acres of Landduring her natural life, after her death the said land above me mentioned to be property of my son John Graham-JI give unto my wife a Horse Bridle & Saddle-Bed and furniture & an equal part of my stock, household and Kitchen furniture plantation IN Tools & to continue on the plantation as long as my wife liveth for her own benefit & the benifit of the children that may live with her, also her choice of my Negroes during her life. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Hugh Grahams Widow one shilling to her & her Heirs for for ever as her full share or part of my Estate Item I give unto my Daughter Sarah Graham a bed & furniture and an equal part of my cattle Hogs & sheep

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Item I give or hath allready given unto my beloved daughter
Elizabeth McAllister one Bed & furniture & her full part of my
stock- Item I give or hath already given unto my daughter Sevil
Hath horn Bed & furniture & her full shape of my cattle- Item

equal part of my stock when she marries or arives to the age_ of twenty one or calls for her devidend- I give unto my daughter Jeen Graham one Bed and furniture and an equal part of my stock when she marries or arives to the age of twenty one years old I give unto my daughter Hester Graham, also to my son James Graham, my son John Graham & my daughter Mary Graham one Bed & furniture and an equal part of my Stock as they marry, or arive to the age of twenty one I give unto My son James Graham two hundred & fifty acres of Land lying on the north side of the swamp one hundred acres of sd Lands lying adjoining to my plantation, part of the lower end of my plantation the remainder lying still below it is my desire that the remainder of my land is to be equally divide d between my daughters that may be living or thier lawfull Ifsue when my youngest Child shall come of age or marry It is my desire that my Horfes & the remainder of my stock shall remain together for the benifit of my wife & children that is now with us or may continue with her Yet I leave it in the power of my Executors to dispose of any part of my stock for the benifit of my wife or children asthey think best- also of my Horses It is my desire that my Negrow named Cook shall be sold by my the first opportunity & the money with a little more aded to the same to purchase a cuntry born negroe man that is capable of looking after my stock & plantation benifits the remainder of my negroes to remain on the plantation to support my wife & Children untill my youngest child arives to the age of twenty one or marrys Then my negroes Horfes Cattle Hogs & Sheep to be equally divided between my wife &

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
