for the Same, do make this my last Will and Testament in manner  
and form following. First I will and desire that I may be decent  
ly buried. I will and Desire that my beloved wife Susanna Cole-  
man, Shall have the full use of all my Estate during her life  
and at her death I will and bequeath as follows(Viz) -

Item. to my Grandson Jacob Wm Williams one negro wench named  
phebe, one horse colt named Riley, and one Hand mill. one news  
pitching ax. Brawd ax and Hand saw. Item to my Daughter Susanna  
Coleman one negro girl named Molly, one mare named Pilot.  
Big wash pot. Dutch oven, and pot rack. Item to my Daughter  
Elizabeth Murphy, one negro boy named Nero. One horse colt  
named Fatal, to her and ~~xxx~~ to the heirs of her body forever.

Item to my Daughter Margaret Barrinow one mare named Lettys  
one flax hackle Item to my daughter Hetty Wil lams one quarter  
of a Dollar. Item to the heirs of my son George Coleman  
Deceas . one quarter of a Dollar. Item to my Grandson George  
Coleman Son of Sam Coleman Ten Dollars . Item that the re-  
mainder of my House Hold & Kitchen furniture plantation <sup>carpenter</sup> and  
Turners tools <sup>and Hogs</sup> be Equally Divided among all my Heirs. And

I do nominate Constitute and Appoint my Daughter Hetty Williams  
Executrix and my Grand Son William Barrinow Executor of this  
my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking, and making, void  
all and Every other will and wills, at any time heretofore by  
me made, and do declare this to be my last will and Testament.
