Item to the heirs of my son George Coleman Deceas . one quarter of a Dollar. Item to my Grandson George Coleman Son of Sam Coleman Ten Dollars . Item that the recarpente Y mainder of my House Hold & Kitchen furniture plantation and Hogs be Equally Divided among all my Heirs.
