Know all men by these presents that I James Gamble of the district and state aforesaid, planter, being in perfect health and of sound mind but knowing the uncertainty of life do constitute this as my last will and testament in the manner and form following. I give and bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Margret our bed and furniture and a horse of her choice and buggy as her own and to reside on my place as long as she remains my widow and to be taken care of during her widowhood. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Hortensa during her natural life Silvy and her family and Gabriel to be included with one fourth of my negroes to have and to hold during her natural life and to the lawful issue of her body if she should die without to return to her Brothers I give and bequeath to my son Lawrence D. Caroline Edwin Perthenia and Draten to be included in his fourth of my negro property and one half of the tract of land where I now reside with the one third of my bedding household and Kitchen furniture with one third of my stock horses cattle and hogs one third of my wagon gear and implements of husbandry one third of all my notes accounts and money that may be found at my death during his natural life then to the lawful issue of his body if he should die without any to return to his Brothers and sister I give and bequeath to my son George E. Louis. Rosetta and Ariman to be included in his part of one fourth of my negro property with one half the tract of land that I gave to H. H. Hanna with one third of my bedding household and Kitchen furniture and one third of my stock horses

Istute this as my last will and testament in the manner and form following. I give and bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Margret our bed and furniture and a horse of her choice and buggy as her own and to reside on my place as long as she remains my widow and to be taken care of during her widowhood. Hanna with one third of my beding household and Kitchen furniture and one third of my stock horses cattle and hogs one third my wagons, gear and implements of husbandry and one third of my notes accounts and money that may be found at my death during his natural life then to the lawful issue of his body and if he should die without any to return to his Brothers and sister, I give and bequeath to my son Hugh Dadley---Eli Maggy. Gadson and Mary and two of her children, Henry. Isabellas to be includen in his fourth of my negro property with the half of the tract of land where I now

reside and one third of my Bedding household and Kitchen furniture
one third of my wagons gear and implements of husbandry and one
third of my notes accounts and money that may be found at my
death during his natural life then to the lawful issue of his
body if he should die without any to return to his Brothers and
Sister. If any of my children should be dissatisfied with my
will so as to go to law I disenherit them, I do nominate &
appoint John F. Nesmith to act as my executor untill my children
becomes of age and I do not wish my property divided untill my
son Hugh Duddly becomes of age I appoint my sons as executors
as they become of age to act with John F. Nesmith

I do declare this as my last will and testament annulling all
former wills made by me or for me, in witness where of I have
hereunto set my hand and seal this 13th. day of August. A. D.
1852
