James Eaddy of South Carolina & Williamsburgh district, being in a low State of health and being in perfect mind and memory recolecting that it is once appointed for all men to die, doth make this my last will and testament, first of all I reccomend my soul to God and my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian human like manner, and the rest of my Worly goods is my desire to be disposed of as follows, I give unto my son John Eaddy three hundred and twenty five acres of land, it being part of a tract of six hundred acres, begining at Pine station on the upper side and runing round per compliment and the remainder of all the lands that I am poSsessed of, I give unto my Wife Mary Eaddy during her life, and at her death it to go to my Son Edward D Eaddy it is also my desire that my Wife Mary Eaddy shall have her Feather Bed and such furniture as she shall see fit to take, and such part of the household furniture as she deem neSsesary for her support, I also leave my son Henry Eaddy the sum of five shillings, it is also my desire that all the remaining part of my Estate be sold and equally divided between my Wife Mary Eaddy & my son Edward D Eaddy and my son John Eaddy, & my Daughter Mary Stone, and my Daughter Sarah ProSser,-----Then I pint my son Edward D Eaddy my whole and sole Executor to this my last Will and Testament, and I do disannul all others made by me as I do Exknoledge this to be my last Will and testament as I have hereunto set my hand and fixt my seal this twenty six day of September in one thousand eight hundred and nineteen and in the forty fourth year of the Independence of the United States of America---in the presence of these witneSses
