JOHN B. BELIN.

In the name of God, Amen, I John B Belin, of the Distt. and State aforesaid being weak in body

but of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding, Praised be God, for the same Do make and declare this my last will and Testament, in manner and form following 1<sup>st</sup> It is my will and desire that all such debts as may incumber my Estate, upon my decease with Funeral expences and that of proving this my last Will and Testament, shall be well and truly Paid-----

Item I give and bequeath unto my neice Esther, I, McDonald, the sum of One Hundred Dollars to be at her will and disposal and her receipt to be the sufficient discharge of my Executor herein after named-----

Item I give and bequeath unto my brother James F Belin the sum of One Hundred Dollars to him his heirs and assigns forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Brother Cleland Belin Three Negroes Viz Betty Charles and Charlotte together with the Increase of such of them as are females to him his Heirs and assigns forever, in order to ascertain the Value of the above named Negroes it is my wish that they shall be appraised-----

Item I give and bequeath unto my Sister Mary Gamble an Equivolent equal in Value to the above named negroes which I have already disposed off-- out of the Moneys arising from the Sale of my share of the real Estate which I am entitled to, and in case said share of Lands does not sell for as much as the amount of said Negroes then it is my Will and desire that my Brother Cleland make up the equivolent but in Case said share of Land do sell for more than the Valuation of said Negroes I wish

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last Will and Testament, shall be well and truly Paid-----

Item I give and bequeath unto my neice Esther, I, McDonald, the sum of One Hundred Dollars to be at her will and disposal and her receipt to be the sufficient discharge of my Executor herein after named-----

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Item I give and bequeath unto my sister Mary Gamble an equivalent equal in Value to the above named negroes which I have already disposed off-- out of the Moneys arising from the sale of my share of the Real Estate which I am entitled to, and in case said share of Lands does not sell for as much as the amount of said Negroes then it is my Will and desire that my Brother Cleland make up the equivalent but in Case said share of Land do sell for more than the Valuation of said Negroes I wish

the overplus to be equally divided share and share alike between my sister Mary Gamble and my Brother Cleland Belin- I likewise give unto my Sister Mary my Watch and Portable Desk to her her Heirs and assigns forever-----

Item the rest and residue of my Estate that I may Die Possessed of or that I may be entitled to I wish to be equally divided between my Brother Cleland Belin and my sister Mary Gamble Share & share alike-----

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Lastly I do hereby Nominate Constitute and appoint my Said  
Brother Cleland Belin whole and sole Executor of this my Last  
will and Testament, hereby revoking and making Void all and  
every other Will or Wills at any time or heretofore by me made  
and do declare this to be my Last Will and Testament in Witne-  
ss whereof I the Said John B Belin, have here unto set my hand  
and seal this 18<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year of our Lord 1821---  
and of the Seventy and Independance of the United States the  
Forty fifth-----
