JOHN FLEMING.

In the Name of God amen--I, John Fleming of Wmsburgh district & State of So. Carolina, being in a low State of health but of sound mind & memory & understanding, praised be to God for the same--do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, To my beloved Daughter Elizabeth Hamilton McCullough I give and bequeath one hundred Dollars together with her bed bedstead and furniture now in her actual posision, To my beloved Daughter Jane ^{Bennet} Burnet Snowden I give devise and bequeath that is to her and her ISSUES a Negro Woman named Cusannah or sue, now in the posision of Wm. Sam¹, But if obtained by a suit at law, at the expences of my Estate, with her issue, that is, if the negro woman sue, and her issue should be obtained at a suit in law, now depending It is my will & I do devise and bequeath the sd. negroe woman and her issue to my Daughter Jane B. Snowden and her issue and to none other whatsoever--But if sd. negroe woman should not be obtained by law, in favor of my estate, I give demise & bequeath to my daughter Jane Bennet Snowden one Negro boy named Joseph and one Negro girl named Elvira, that is to my daughter Jane and her ISSUE I give demise and bequeath Joseph and Elvira & their issue like wise her bed and furniture now in her posision, and all the Ballance of my Estate real and personal except what I herein after name It is my will that it shall be equally divided amongst my sons when my Youngest son Pinknwy shall be of the age twenty one years, and to my Beloved Wife Ann Fleming I give demise and bequeath one third of my household and Kitchen furniture likewise one third of my real estate during her life or widowhood with my negroes womans Sabinah and Nancy and my

McCullough I give my wife Susanna S.C. wife of John McCullough
with her bed bedstead and furniture now in her actual position,
To my beloved Daughter Jane Burnet Snowden I give devise and
bequeath that is to her and her issue a Negro woman named
Susannah or sue, now in the position of Wm. Sam¹, fruit if
obtained by a suit at law, at the expence of my estate, with
her issue, that is, if the negro woman sue, and her issue should
be obtained at a suit in law, now depending It is my Will & I
do devise and bequeath the sd. negro woman and her issue to my
Daughter Jane B. Snowden and her issue and to none other what-
soever--But if sd. negro woman should not be obtained by law,
in favor of my estate, I give demise & bequeath to my daughter
Jane Bennet Snowden one Negro boy named Joseph and one Negro

expences &c and I do make nominate constitute and appoint my
sons William and Thomas Together with my Friends John McCullo-
ugh and Alexander McCrea sole administrators of this my last
will and Testament--In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this 20th day of Jany. in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and sixteen--
