James; Soloman Rhodes; and Richard Sessions; And I also Will that if either of those under Named Children James; Soloman H. or Hichard S. Should die not leaving Ishue, that their part of the Estate shall be Equally divided between the other two living Uhildren -- I farther Will and desire and Constitute My Son James and My Son Soloman Rhodes, I Appoint my only and sole Executors and I do utterly disannul and revoke all and Every other Will Reckoning this only to be my last will and Testament I witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fifteenth day of June in the Year of Our Lord One thousan Eeight hundred and thirteen-Signed Sealed and Delivered in the Presence of Nathaniel McCollough )
