

I John McMurray do make this my last will & testament in the manner and form following Viz. First I will that my body be buried in a plain decent manner in James G McGills burying ground, Secondly, I will to my dear beloved wife Sarah Strong McMurray, my horse called Barny-lynn, my riding chare and harness, her choice of my beds with a reasonable allowance of furniture to it, two trunks taking her choice & a decent suit of morning---Thirdly, I will to my honored Mother the sum of twenty five dollars--- Fourthly, I will to my Brother James McMurray my suit of black Viz. Coat, waist coat (the best) and pantilbans--- It is my desire that my Negro & horse in Chester district be immediately sold & the monies arising therefrom be immediately appropriated to pay my most pressing debts, that the first hundred dollars that can be called be paid to David McClary for the like sum I have borrowed from him, it is my will & desire that my estate real and personal be sold to the best advantage, that my lawful debts be paid as early as possible & that the remainder be divided equally between my beloved wife Sarah Strong McMurray & my daughter Mary Ann McMurray share and share alike, that my Daughter Mary Ann McMurrays part be put to interest for her untill she arrives to the age of twenty years or marries--- Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute & appoint James McMurray and Henry H Bostwick executors of this my last will & testament, hereby revoking & making void all & every other will & wills at any time heretofore by me made, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this second day of April Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and thirteen----
