

I, Joseph Coachman being in my sound mind and memory doth with my own hand write this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following I give and bequeath to my Wife Margaret her and to x heirs forever one famely of Negroes a wench named Peggy and all her Children with all my household and kitchen furniture at my Decease to do with as She ma think proper The remainder of my Estate I leave to be saqually devided into five parts to wit one fifth part I give and bequeath to my life Margaret and to her heirs forever one fifth part I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Lynch Simons and to her heirs forever one fifth part I give and bequeath to my Daughter Hannah Green and to her heirs forever one fifth part I give and bequeath to x <sup>my</sup> Son--- Benjamin Coachman and to his heirs forever one fifth part I give and bequeath to my Son Isaac Coachman and to his heirs forever and it is my Will and desire that there shall be no division of my estate untill my Youngest Child becomes of age except the Wench Peggy and her Children above mentioned with my household and kitchen furneture which my Wife is to have at my Decease and to do with as she ma think propper And I do Nominate and appoint my Wife Margarte and my Brother John Coachman Executors to this my Last Will and Testament and I do Revok all other Wills whatsoever In witneSs I have here set my hand and Seal this seventh day of September one thousand eight hundred and thirteen and being the thirty seventh of the Independence of America---
