Narow, and I desire that my Mother Frances Stone, and my beloved wife Frances R Stone, do live together, and if they cannot agree to remain, then my Executors hereinafter named shall/my Mother Frances Stone a comfortable poll house Bilt between my now residence and Josiah G Parsons, and at her death the said property & house before bequeathed to belong to my beloved wife Frances R Stone, and at the death of my wife to be Equally divided between My Lawful heirs (third) I give and devise unto my beloved wife Frances R Stone all the rest and residue of my Estate both Real and Personal during her natural life and at her death to be equally divided spong/my/chilleron share & share alike between my children should there be any and in the Event that I have no Children or child living at her death, then and in that Case my Estate is to be divided equally between her children, should any survive at that time, Should my beloved Wife Frances R Stone survive me and Marry again, It is my wish and desire that the husband whom she may marry Shall have no control of the property belonging to my Estate in any way whatever in furtherance of my devise & my desire all the property belonging to my Estate both Real & Personal shall only be subject to the Order and directions of my Executors to this my devise Fourthly & Lastly I hereby constitute & appoint my beloved friends Ezra Eaddy & Thomas Eaddy and Benjamin Gause Executors of this my last will & Testament
