

In the name of God Amen:

I Mary Ann McGill of the State and District aforesaid being of sound mind and disposing memory do make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form as follows to wit:
Item 1st I give desire and bequeath to my son Minto W. McGill all my real Estate to be his absolutely and forever upon condition of his paying into the hands of my Executors at the time of the division of my property the full and just sum of four hundred Dollars-----

Item 2nd It is my will and desire that all my Negroes (except the girl Bina) be equally divided between my children, that each child shall hold his or her portion during his or her natural life and after his or her death then such portion with its increase shall go to their children, but if either of my children shall die leaving no lawful issue I give and devise the portion of the child so dieing with its increase to my surviving children during their lives and after their death to their children---Item 3

As my daughter Jane Caroline Scott is in more needy circumstances than my other children I give devise and bequeath to my said daughter Jane Caroline Scott over and above her share of my negroes during her natural life and after her death to her children the negro girl Bina with her future increase---Item 4

It is my wish that the negro women Nancy and Victory shall have the liberty of selecting to which of my children they would prefer to belong and that it be so ~~xxxx~~ arranged in the division of my negroes---Item 5-- I give devise and bequeath to my four daughters Elizabeth A. ~~xxx~~ Scott, Jane Caroline Scott, Mary McCottry Burgesa and Mary Ann Sanders Murphy my four pieces of mahogany furniture----

Item 6 I give devise and bequeath to my grand daughter Mary Ann Scott one feather bed as a token of my remembrance---

Item 7 The residue of my estate after the payment of all my just debts shall be equally divided between all my children--
