I Mary Bradley of South Carolina and Williamsburgh district being weak and frail in body, but of sound mind memory and understanding, recollecting the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death, and feeling desirous before my decease to dispose of such worldly property with <sup>which</sup> it has pleased God to bless me I do therefore make and constitute this instrument and no other to be my last Will and Testament as follows

Imprimis I Will and bequeath unto my son William Wilson Bradley a Negro girl named Betsy to him and his heirs

Item, I will and bequeath unto my son James Bradley one Negro man named Daniel to him and his heirs

Item, I Will and bequeath unto my son Robert Bradley one young Negro man named Friday to him and his heirs

Item, I Will and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Stewart Wilson one Negro Woman named Gullo Binah to her and her heirs

Item, I Will and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Bradley one Negro Woman named Aimy to her and her heirs

Item, I Will and bequeath unto my Daughter Janet Martha Bradley one Negro Woman named Subinah to her and her heirs

Item, I Will and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Cat-berry Bradley one Negro girl named Betty to her and her heirs

Item, I Will and bequeath unto Margaret Elvira Fulton one Negro girl named Doll to her and her heirs

Item, It is my Will and desire that all the rest of my property be equally divided among my sons and Daughters and Grand daughter above named, if after a fair valuation the property named to some of them be more valuable than that named to others, then it is my Will that those that have more shall make up to those that have less so that all shall share and share alike
