In the name of God. Amen. I wary Stretche being weak in body but of perfect mind and memory, Do make, ecretitute ordain, and declare this to be my last Will and Testament revoking and annulling all other Wills and Testaments heretofore made by me----- Imprimis it is my wish that all my debts be paid as soon as possible---

Item I give to my Grandson William Newman Murrel the whole of my Estate both real and Personal when he attaineth the age of Twenty one or when he hath a Child by him lawfully begotten in marriage. It is also my Will & desire that my Executors hereafter named do take into their possession the whole of my Estate both real and Personal and retain the same in trust for my Grandson William Newman Murrel untill he arrives to the age of Twenty one. But in case my Grandson William Newman Murrel should die before he hath a child by him lawfully begotten in marriage or before he attaineth the age of Twenty one, then and in that case it is my Will and desire that my Estate both real and Personal be divided between my nieces Elizabeth Tod. Agnes Brown. and Mary Campbell and my nephew William Campbell in manner following. Elizabeth Tod to have two fifths and the other three fifths to be equally divided between Agnes Brown, Mary Ca mpbell, and William Campbell and I appoint my trusty friends James Campbell and William Salter, Executors to this my last Will and Testament. In testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand and Seal this 26 day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eight
