In the name of wood salling coling iches selection of the State of "outh Carolina Williams District being yet in my sences but finding myself declining and knowing that is appointed for all men once to die do make this my last will and Testament first of all I recommend my Soul to God that gave and hope that he will receive the same again and as to what worldly goods it hath pleased God to bless me with I dispose of inthe following manner (Vis) It is my desire that all my lawful debts be paid. It is my desire that all my perishable property except my negroes shall be sold by my Executors as soon as possible and the moneys arrising therefrom to be put out to Interest for the benifit of my-children Schooling, &cmy lands & negroes to be rented and hired out by my Executors, also for the benifit of my children as my children come of age or marrys, I desire that they shall then have their equal part of my Estate, the remainder part of my Estate shall remain in the hands of my Executors untill the next comes of age or marrys then to have there part, and soon till the last gets their part the names of my Children are thus Mary Benton Simion T Benton Ann Harrell Benton and Sarah Benton It is my desire that my Estate real and personal shall be equally divided between my four children as they come of age or marry my Executors to have full power to sell my property such as have been mentioned to be sold public or at private as they sahll deem most advantageous for the childrenglastly I constitute and appoint my Friends and Brothers in law Simion Timmons and Isaac Timmons Executors to tjis my last will and Testament In confirmation whereof I set my hand and seal this 15th day of October 1816---Benton Moses Signed Sealed in the presence mark
