I Paul Jaudon of Williamsburgh district Flanter being very
Sick and Weak in Body but of perfect Mind and Memory thanks
be given unto God. Therefore calling unto the Mortality of
my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all Men to die,
do make and ordain this my last will and Testament. That
is to say principally and first of all, I recommend my Sould
into the hands of the Almighty God that gave it. And as
toutching such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God
to bless me in this Life. I give demise and dispose of the
same in the following manner and form.

First. I give and bequeath to Elizabeth my dearly beloved wife a Horse Chair & Harness (she chusing the Horse she thinks proper) as a Legacy.

I leave unto my Loving Wife Elizabeth Jaudon her equal part of a childs share of all and of every thing I possess. during her Life and at her Death to return equally amongst her Children by me I leave my Wife Elizabeth Executing to: this my last Will and Testament. I leave unto my children .Paul, Alexander, James, Samuel, Esther and Sarah an equal part or share of all I possess to be equally divided amongst them and their Mother "If any child or children should die during their minority the whole blood Children remaining shall share equally their part so dying. Note whatever Child or Children should hereafter be born to me by my wife they shall share exactly alike with the seme aned! As it is my utmost desire that all my Just Debts should be paid as early Possable, after my disease. I do recommend to the Executors and the Executrix hereafter named to sell my lands or such Negroes as they in their judgement may think proper--- and Lastly I appoint my loveing Friends Alexander Glass Samuel Perdriau as Executors to this my last Will and Testament together with my wife Elizabeth above named .
