PAUL MICHAU

South Carolina, Williamsburgh District-----

30th December 1811. In the name of God Amen---

I Paul Michau Senior of aforesaid State & District being of sound mind & memory thanks be unto God, but labouring in great infirmity of body- and well knowing that it is appointed for all men to die- Do make & ordain this my last will & testament in manner following Viz, Imprimis

It is my will and desire that my body be decently Interred & that all my Just debts & funeral Expenses be paid 2^d It is my will that my Daughter Ann Michau, Dorothy Michau & Charlotte Michau have & enjoy without lett or interruption or hindrance --- the free use & sole enjoyment of the House I now live in; together with all the out buildings--- as also so much of the arable grounds as may be necessary for the culture of such negroes as may fall to there lot from the hereafter division of my Personal estate 3^d It is my will & order that the aforesaid privilege is only to continue during the time of their continuance in a single or unmarried state---& on the contingency of their entering into a state of Wedlock this privilege to cease---as respects the married--

4th It is my will & desire--- that all my real Estate-sub-^d ^dject neverthe-less to the 2^d & 3^d Items aforesaid--- be equally divided---between my Son Alexander Michau- and my Grandson Isaac Samuel Singletary- by lot---

5th It is my will and desire that all my Personal Estate as respects my negroes-slaves, be equally divided between all my surviving children share & share alike not including Pine

herit her part Item It is my will that all my stock of cat-
tle Hogs, horses, sheep, Household & Kitchen furniture be equally
divided between my Children aforesaid---or if that cannot be
advantageously done---to be sold at public sale & the monies
threfrom arising to be equally divided between them Share &
Share alike, as also spinathe or mony in hand to be equally
divided Item It is my will & desire that all my Plantation
