land Wilson who departed this life some time in the month of  
October last, and who was one of the named legatley in the said, <sup>Last</sup>  
will and testament, have thought--proper to ~~make~~ and ratify this  
as a Codicil to the same----1<sup>st</sup>. I will and bequeath to my  
beloved wife Mary S Wilson in addition to the legacy left to her  
in my aforesaid Will and testament two negroes Leah and Ameritta  
the daughters of Sitirah with there increase during the term of  
her natural life, also a Horse and riding Chair & harness--I  
also Will and bequeath to my son James E Wilson in addition to  
the legacy left to him in my said Will, one Negro Man named  
Jacob (a black Smith ) which negro I value at eight hundred dol-  
lars--I also Will and bequeath to my son David Elisha Wilson  
an equal division of my real Estate with my two sons James E  
Wilson and John R. W. Wilson---And my Will and meaning is that  
this Codicil be adjudged to be a part and parcel of my last  
Will and testament, that all things therein mentioned be faith-  
fully and truly performed, and as fully and amply in every resp  
ect, as if the same ware so declared and set forth in my last  
Will and testament, Witness my hand and seal this eighth day of  
January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and  
seventeen, and of American Independence the forty first---
