SOLOMON MCCLAM.

In the name of God amen--I Solomon McClam Sen, of the State of South Carolina Williamsburgh District being weak in body but of sound & perfect mind & memory blessed be Almighty God for the same do make & publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say First I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Anne Three hundred acres of land beginning at the burnt Bay line & running that line to the corner then a straitline to the long Branch or neer the long Branch then down to Bryane McClams line then along Briants McClam line to the Bay Branch Then up the Burnt Bay Branch to the beginning for Three Hundred acres more or less the Same Three Hundred Acres to be hers during her natural life & at her death to be Equally divided Among the Issue of her Body Also a Bed Stead & furnature and & Five head of Cattle, the cattle is marked with a crop & two splits in the left Ear, which property I wish hers during her natural life & at her death to be equally divided among her children 2, I will & bequeath unto my Son Daniel all my other land including my plantation Houses & the same being two thousand nine hundred acres of land more or less--I also will & bequeath unto my son Daniel, all my Stock of Horses, Cattle & hogs and all my House & Kitchen furniture out of which property I wish my Son Daniel to pay all my lawful debts, I wish him also to pay my Daughter Jane Smith eighty Dollars which sum I want applied to the purchase of land for her use during her natural life & at her death to be equally divided among the issue of her body----I Give & Bequeath my daughter Lizza Singeltary Five Dollars which sum I want paid her by my Son Daniel, I also Will & Bequeath unto My Son Solomon my Bed & furnature & one Hundred Dollars--If he does return--If he does not return

 I wish my Son Daniel to pay all my lawful debts, I wish him al-  
 so to pay my Daughter Jane Smith eighty Dollars which sum I  
 want applied to the purchase of land for her use during her  
 natural life & at her death to be equally divided among the is-  
 sue of her body----I Give & Bequeath my daughter Lizza Singel-  
 tary Five Dollars which sum I want paid her by my Son Daniel, I  
 also Will & Bequeath unto My Son Solomon my Bed & furnature &  
 one Hundred Dollars--If he does return--If he does not return  
 the Said Property to remain my Son Daniel I also Will & Beque-  
 ath my Son Bryane Five Dollars which sum I want to be paid to  
 him by my Son Daniel---And Lastly as to the residue of my Esta-  
 te goods & Chattles of ~~what~~ what kind & nature So Ever I give  
 & Bequeath the same to my Son Daniel who I appoint along with  
 my Son Bryant Executors to my last will & testament and do re-  
 voke all other wills made previous in WitneSs Where of I have
