WILLIAM CAMPBELL.

In the Name of God amen

I William Campbell of Williamsburgh District and State of So Carolina being of sound mind and memory but weak in body, do make this my last will and testament. I do first of all authorise my Executors to pay out of my Estate all my Just and lawfull debts--after which I will and bequeath to my loving wife Mary Campbell Two thirds of my Personal Estate, and one half of my real Estate--and I do hereby bequeath to my Child William McKnight Campbell the remaining one third of my Personal Estate and the remaining one half of my Real Estate I do also will and bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Campbell Two hundred dollars out of my Estate for the Purpose of building her a Comfortable Dwelling house and I do hereby nominate & appoint my wife Mary Campbell as my Executrix and brother James Campbell, and William Salters my Executors to this my last will and Testament--and I do hereby revoke and renounce all my former Wills, and declare this my last will and testament in Witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal, the twenty seventh day of February A. D. one thousand eight hundred & sixteen signed and sealed in the Presence of
