In the name of God amen I William J Presley of the District of Williamsburgh and State aforesaid being weak in Body but of sound mind Do make and declare this my last Will and Testament Viz I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Elizabeth Presley one negro woman named (Chloe) this to be considered in lieu of Dower and in full of personal Estate and whereas it is probable that my wife may now be pregnant I give and bequeath the Balance of my Estate both personal and real to my Daughter Sarah and the said child that she may be pregnant with share and share alike I further wish it understood that should either of my said children die before it shall have arrived to the years of Twenty one or marriage the survivor shall hier the part so belonging to that child

Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my Uncle W B Brookington John B Presly and Jas. F Presly my Brothers Executors to this my last Will & Testament hereby revoking and making Void all Will or Wills heretofore by me made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this seventeenth day of september in the Year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and Thirty and of Fifty fifth of American independance Signed sealed declared
