

In the Name of God, Amen. I, W. W. Cockfield of the District of Williamsburg, State of South Carolina; being weak of body, but of sound and reasoning mind, and fully impressed with the uncertainty of life, do make and publish this my last will and testament for the purposes hereafter specified.

Imprimis---I desire that after the breath shall leave this frail tenement of Clay, and my spirit shall return to God who gave it, my body be decently interred at the Baptist Church in said district known as "Belin" Church"

2. I desire that all my just and lawful debts be paid^d out of any monies, which may be in my possession at the time of my death, or out of the proceeds of any property held by me at that time; and the remainder I dispose of in the form and manner following, to wit

3. I give and bequeath to my sister Juliana J. Sturges, the sum of One Dollar.

4. I give and bequeath to my Neice Julia Sturge's the sum of One Dollar.

5. To my Cousins Catherine A. Anderson, and Josiah C. McKessen;^{W/N} I give and bequeath the residue of my property, to ~~share~~ share and share alike, that is, One half to Catherine. A. Anderson, and the other half to Josiah C. McKessen.^{W/N}

6. I desire that the amount bequeathed to Catherine. A. Anderson be appropriated to her Education, under the Management of my Executor to be hereafter named.

Lastly. It is my desire that my Cousin Dr. J. C. McKessen^{W/N} such as my Executor, and I do hereby Constitute and appoint him Executor of this my last will and testament.
