and before the sealing and Delivery of these presents by
Lark Robison of Burk County in the state of Georgia
the Receipt thereof I do hereby acknowledge have bar-
gained and sold, and by these presents do Bargain and
sell and Deliver unto the said Lark Robison a Negro
Man Slave named Prymas to have and to hold these
Negro prymas unto the said Lark Robison his Ex-
ecutors Administrators and Assigns to his and their
only proper use and behoof forever, and I the said
William Robison my Executors and Administrators
the said Bargained premises unto the said Lark

Robison his Executors Administrators and Assigns from
and against all persons shall and will warrant and forever
Defend by these presents in Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal Dated this 3rd Day of July in the Year
of our Lord one Thousand seven hundred and Ninety and
in the fifteenth Year of the Independence of the United
States

of Winton County in the State of South Carolina plan-
ter, being in perfect health and in sound & perfect memo-
ry thanks be to the Almighty God for his mercies and
goodness do make and ordain and constitute this my
Last Will and Testament, and desire it may be
received by all as such. I recommend my body
to the dust of earth whence it was taken and my
Soul to the hands of the Almighty God who gave
it beseeching his most gracious acceptance

28 of it thro' the all sufficient merits and mediation of my
most compassionate redeemer Jesus Christ humbly
beseeching the most blessed and glorious Trinity -
One God most holy most merciful and gracious to prepare
me for the time of my Dissolution and then to take
me to himself into that peace and rest and incom-
parable felicity which he has prepared for all that
Love and fear his holy name Amen blessed be
God. As to my small worldly Estate I desire that
all my Just debts be paid by my Executors hereafter
named they selling or disposing of any part as they
shall think proper of my personal Estate to the pay-
ing of such Debts.

And I give to my daughter Nancy One Cow
and a calf.

Item I give to my son Joshua the Smiths tools
which I lent him some years ago. And to
his son John I give One Cow and a calf.

Item for divers just causes and considerations moving
myself therunto I give to my son Richard One
Shilling Sterling and I do thereby disinherit
him and his Heirs of any further part or parcel of
this my last Will and Testament.

Item I give to my son David the Wagon and all
that appertaineth therunto. And to my son Victor two Cows & Calves
Item I give to my son Theophilus the House and
plantation I now lie on with three hundred and
fifty Acres of Land appertaining therunto hav-
ing of it nevertheless in full possession of my dear
beloved Wife during her Widowhood and after that
to be managed at the discretion of my Executors un-
till my son Theophilus shall be Capable of receiv-
ing of it into his own possession and the
Remainders

29 of my Land I leave to be Equally divided between my
two sons David and Victor. And if my son Theophilus
dies without lawful Heirs then his part shall ascend to
his brother Victor and his Heirs. And if his Brother
Victor dies without lawful Heirs then it shall become
the property of my Grand son John Edwards the son
of David Edwards his Heirs and Assigns forever.
Item I give to my beloved Wife the Horse and
the remainder of my neat Cattle and all the Hogs
that is in my Marke for her use during Widowhood
as likewise all the plantation Tools and after that
they shall become wholly and solely my son Theophilus
excepting two Cows & Calves shall give out of them to
Victor. And likewise I give to my beloved Wife all
the household furniture of all kinds with my wear-
ing apparel to be managed at her discretion dur-
ing her life time and after that to be divided be-
tween Victor and Theophilus my sons. I likewise
leave all my Carpenters Tools with the cross Cutt
saw to my two sons David and Victor to divide them
between themselves at their own discretion. And I do
likewise appoint Constitutors and ordain Joseph Turner
Augustus Williams and my son David to be Executors
of this my last Will and Testament and trustees
for my Wife and son Theophilus and I do hereby
Revoke and disannul and make Void every former
Will and Testament by me made. In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 12th day
of June in the Year of our Lord 1790
