be buried at the discretion of my Executors. Thirdly I give & dispose
of all my Worldly goods in manner & form Following
Item I give & bequeath to my well beloved Wife Sarah South
well all my Household furniture to be for Use during her Life time
after her Decease to equally divided between my three Sons and my
Daughter Mary Southwell — Item I give & bequeath to my well
beloved Wife Sarah Southwell all my Stock of ~~Cattle~~ during
her natural Life, & after her Decen to be equally divided between
my three Sons Edward, John, William & my Daughter Mary South
well & this I leave as my last Will & Testament, revoking & disalow-
ing all former Wills & this I acknowledge & set my Hand & Seal
affix my Seal in the Presence of these Witnesses & I leave my
Wife & my Son Edward Southwell to be my Executors

Negroes with the future Increase of the females thereof, unto the said
George Robison his Executors Administrators & Assigns, to him & their
only proper use & behoof for Ever: & I the said James Jones my Heirs
Executors, Administrators & Assigns the said bargain'd premises
unto the said George Robison his Executors, Administrators and
Assigns from and against all Persons shall & will Warrant and
for ever defend by these presents, in Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my Hand & Seal this 3rd Day of June 1786 and
in the Tenth Year of the Independence of America
