

Know all Men by these presents that I James Collins of the State of South Carolina & County of Winton for & in consideration of the sum of Eighty two pounds Sterling to me in hand paid by Thomas Morris of the same State & County the Receipt of which is hereby acknowledged have I bargained & sold & by these presents do bargain & sell unto the said Thomas Morris, his heirs, Executors, Administrators & Assigns, One Negro Man named Bob, about Twenty years Old, which said Negro, I do & will warrant, from me & my heirs & from all other person or persons, all claims and demands whatsoever to make Warant and unto unto the said Thomas Morris, his heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns forever, a Good right Title and property to the said Negro Man Bob, & by these presents will warrant & defend the same from all claims and Demands from all persons whatsoever, as WITNES my hand & Seal this 22^d day of November 1790. & the fifteenth Year of the Independence of North America.

Roy & the further sum of Five Shillings Sterling to me in hand paid, the Receipt of which is hereby acknowledged do give & bestow unto my said Son George M. Roy, One Negro Woman Slave named Genor & her Four children, Sam Bill, Doctor and Lizzey, & all their future Increase to him & his heirs forever, & I do for myself & my heirs, & from all persons whatsoever hereby warrant & will for ever defend, the said Negroes Genor, Sam Bill, Doctor & Lizzey to the said George M. Roy & his heirs by these presents. & also Six Acres Market with an upper Square in each Ear & under Seal in the right to him & his heirs for ever & do hereby warrant & will for ever defend the above said Six Acres from all persons whatsoever & they are Granted & A. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this 27th day of August 1790.
