named Subinah, one Negro Boy named Mingo, one Negro Boy named
Isaac, both Children of the above named Negro Woman Subinah, & that
on the due performance of the above payment this Mortgage to be
Null & Void &c In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand & Seal
this sixteenth Day of May in the Year of our Lord one thousand
seven hundred eighty nine — James Simms Seal
