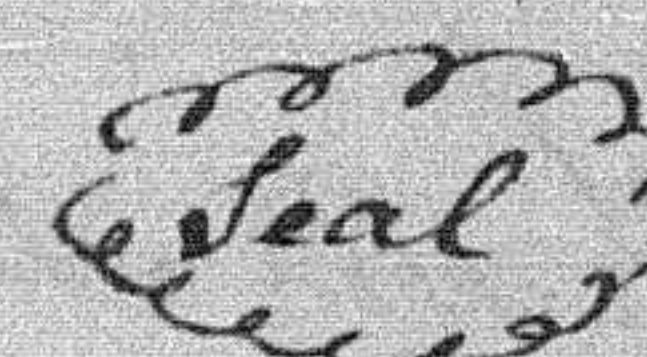

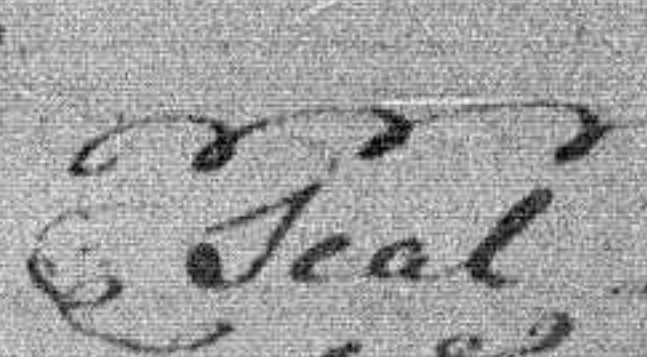

I give dism^s & bequeath unto him & his heirs all my Messuag Lands, Tenements and heridiments thereunto belonging, and wherefor which I also charge with the payment of the said Legacies. In Witness whereof, I have hereunt set my Hand & Seal, the 19th Day of September, & the Year of our Lord 1788.
