to be equally divided between my four Sons & one Daughter

my Soul into the Hands of Almighty God that give it & my
I recommend to the Earth to be decently buried in Christian
Burial at the discretion of my Executors Nothing doubting
but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the mighty God & as touching such Worldly
Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this
Life I give demise & dispose of in the following Manner &
Form — First I give & bequeath to James Collins my
well beloved eldest Son the Plantation or tract of Land
whereon I now live containing three hundred Acres
together with the messuages & Tenements belonging thereto
& one Negro Man named Bob freely to be possessed with —

ter Elizabeth Toner one Negro Woman named Tamar
freely by her to be possessed with —

ter Lydia Collins one Negro Girl named Pen & two feather
Beds by her freely to be possessed with —

I likewise give and bequeath to my well beloved Son
John Collins one Negro Man named Sam by him
freely to be possessed with —

I likewise Give & bequeath to my beloved Son
Major Broom Collins one Negro Man named Mingo
by him freely to be possessed with —

I likewise Give & bequeath to my well beloved
Daughter Mary Collins one Negro Girl named Vile
and one Feather Bed freely by her to be possessed with —

I likewise give & bequeath to my well beloved
Daughter Susannah Collins one Negro Girl named
97^m & all my Stock of Neat Cattle freely by her to
be possessed with —
