John Wickley, of the State District & County aforesaid, his Heirs Executors and Administrators; All that Tract or Parcel of Land, containing one thousand four hundred and sixty eight Acres. Situate in Orangeburgh District, on Murdaugh's Branch, Waters of Savannah River; Originally Granted unto the said Capt. John Wickley. Together with all and singular, the Rights, Members, and Appurtenances whatsoever, unto the said Reuben Newman and Alexander Newman belonging, or in anywise appurtenant. To have & to hold the same, and every part and parcel thereof. In Witness whereof, we have hereunto Set our Hands & Seals, this fourteenth Day of June, One thousand seven hundred and eighty seven. & of the Sovereignty and Independence of the United States of America the Eleventh. Never theless, it is the true Intent and meaning of this Instrument of Writing, That if the above named Reuben Newman & Alexander Newman, their Heirs Executors or Administrators, or any of them, do and shall well & truly Refund, and Pay back unto the said John Wickley, his Heirs & Assigns the above sum of One thousand Pounds Sterl. money as aforesaid, with Legal Interest thereon, by the first Day of April, in the Year One thousand seven hundred and Ninety.
