sound mind, memory & understanding do make and publish this my last Will
and Testament in manner & form following that is to say it is my Will & desire
that my Funeral Charges, & lawful Debts be discharged by my Executors here
after named Mentioned — Item I leave devise & bequeath unto my belo
ved Wife Ann Filput one Negro Wench named Nell & her Issue together with
three Negro Boys, Viz^t Prince, Dick, & Hard Times, likewise all my household
furniture & all my Stock of Cattle, Horses, Hogs, Sheep &c to her & to her Use
during her Life & after her Death I leave devise & bequeath the above
part of my Estate to my Son George Filput to him & his Heirs begotten of
his Body & in case he should Die without Heirs begotten of his Body, it
is my Desire that the said Estate shall be equally divided between my
surviving Heirs — Item I leave devise & bequeath unto my belo
ved Son Daniel Filput one Negro Wench named Jinah & her Issue, also
one Negro Fellow named Sambo, & one Negro Wench named Annoritta &
her Issue to him & his use during his Life & after his Death it is my Will &
desire the Negroes & their Increase that I have left to my Son Daniel
Filput during his Life shall be equally divided between his Children
begotten of his Body & in case his Children should all Die without
Heirs begotten of their Bodies it is my Desire that the s^d Estate should be
equally divided amongst my surviving Heirs — Item I leave devise
& bequeath unto my beloved Son Thom^l Filput, one Negro Fellow named Jfaai
and one Negro Fellow named Annable, one Negro Boy named Plenty & one
Negro Girl named Jubo & her Issue to him & his Heirs begotten of his Body
and if he should Die without Heirs begotten of his Body, it is my Will &
Desire that the Negroes & their Increase that I have bequeathed to him
shall be equally between my surviving Heirs — Item I leave devise &
bequeath to my beloved Daughter Elizabeth Filput now McElhany Five Ne
groes Viz^t Judith, Jane & Jenner, Old April & Young April & their Issue, to
her Heirs begotten of her Body & if she should Die without Heirs begotten of
her Body it is my Will & desire that the Negroes & their Increase that I have
bequeathed to her shall be equally divided between my surviving Heirs.
Item I leave devise & bequeath unto my beloved Wife Ann
Filput my Tract of Land on the four Mile Branch containing one hun
dred Acres where I formerly had a Grist Mill to her during her Life
and after her Death I leave & bequeath the said Land to my Son George
Filput to him and his Heirs begotten of his Body & if he should Die
without Heirs begotten of his Body it is my Will & desire that the
said Land shall belong to my Son Tho^l Filput & his Heirs for ever —
I leave devise & bequeath to my Grandson David Filput Son of my
Son

62 Son Daniel Telput a Tract of Land that my Son Daniel now lives on containing one hundred & fifty Acres be the same more or less to him and his Heirs be gotten of his Body and he should Die without Heirs be gotten of his Body it is my Will & desire that the said Tract of Land shall belong to the next surviving of my Son Daniel to him & his Heirs for Ever.

Item it is my Will & desire, that the Tract of Land whereon I now live & my Saw Mill & all Lands is now my Property or shall hereafter prove to be my Property that is not bequeathed above must be sold & the Money laid out to the best advantage for Negroes. & the Negroes to be equally divided amongst my surviving Heirs to them and their Heirs for Ever.

And lastly I nominate constitute & appoint my well beloved Friend Alexander Newman, Stephen Smith and John McHenry my Executors to this my last Will & Testament here by Revoking all former Wills made by me in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand & fix my Seal this 8th Day of August 1787. & the Twelfth Year of the Independence of the United States of North America

Tho. Newman } The above Will & Testament of Tho. Telput was proved in open Court by the Oath of Will^m Vince one of the Witnesses, who also Swore that he saw Tho. Galphin & Thomas Newman sign the same as Witnesses & that the Testator was at the Time of Signing & Publishing the same of sound Mind & perfect Memory to the best of his Belief & Judgment, Whereupon it was Ordered by the Court to be Recorded.

63 In the name of God Amen. I Christopher Hicks of the State of South Carolina & County of Winton being in a low state of health tho' of a Perfect & sound Memory, do constitute this my Last Will & Testament as followeth — I am I give & bequeath to my well beloved Son Armistead Hicks, the one hundred & fifty Acres of Land whereon I now live, provided never theless that my well beloved Wife Wilmoth hold possession of the same during her life time, & I do hereby appoint my Wife Wilmoth Executrix, & my Son Armistead Executor, of this my Last Will & Testament. I give & bequeath to my Son Armistead a Waggon & gear thereunto belonging, I send to my well beloved Wife during her natural Life, one Negro Boy named George, and after her Death to be the Value thereof equally divided between my Son Armistead, & my two Daughters Sarah & Prudence, giving my said Son the privilege to keep the fore said Negro himself, and paying my two fore said Daughters their equal parts thereof. I send to my Wife Wilmoth all the Stock I am possessor of both Horses, Cattle & Hogs, during her Life, which is to be equally divided at her Death, between my three Children my Son Armistead and my two Daughters Sarah & Prudence. I give & bequeath to my Son Armistead my Smiths Tools, and as to my House furniture, I send to my Wife during her Life, & at her Death to be equally divided between my three Children Vizt. my Son Armistead & my two Daughters Sarah & Prudence. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand & Seal this Twentieth Day of September, One thousand seven hundred and eighty Eight
