Cambridge, July 3 Lewis, Thomas Moore in behalf of Zachariah Griffen is to have Dublin & Dave.

Morris for and in consideration of sum of Seventy four Pounds Sterling, to me in hand paid, bargained & sold & delivered unto John Platts, one Negro Girl named Dido, about fourteen Years old, which said Negⁿ Girl. I do by these presents Warrant & Defend her, from a Persons or persons whatever, who shall or may lay any Title or Claim; unto the said John Platts, or his Heirs, Administrators or Assigns forever; Given under my Hand this 11th Day of August 1788 & the Thirteenth Year of America Independence —

To all people unto whom this present writing shall come
 I Joseph Brook of South Carolina Winton County send
 greeting. Seew ye that I the said Joseph Brook for
 divers good causes and valuable consideration me hereunto
 moving have given and granted and by these presents do
 give grant and Confirm unto William Brook the
 Son of John Brook of the said County One Negro -
 Woman named Tillie and her son called Frank
 Together with all her increase the issue of her body
 either male or female unto the said William Brook
 and his Lawful Heirs, begotten in holy wedlock, and if
 the said William Brook should at his decease have
 no children lawfully begotten. Then in such case the
 above Negro Woman and all her increase shall return
 back to his Brothers and their Heirs after them and the
 said Negro Woman and her increase is to remain
 in the possession of Joseph Brook his Heirs during life
 And after the decease of the Joseph Brook, then
 the above Negro, peaceably and quietly to be put in posse-
 sion of the said William Brook, and to remain in his
 and his Lawful Heirs forever. And the said William
 Brook is not, Bargain, Sell or convey the said Negro
 Woman or any of her increase whatever to any person
 or persons, but that the said property is Intacted from me
 after my death to said William Brook and his
 rising Heirs from Age to Age. In witness whereof I the
 said Joseph have signed set my hand and seal the
 28th day of September 1790.
