

Know all men by these Presents, That I Thomas Wylde of the State of South Carolina & County of Winton, for and in consideration of complying with a Law of this State, that the Justices of the several County Courts, shall be impowered to receive a Donation of Two or more Acres of Land whereon to erect a Court House & other Publick Buildings. I do hereby for that special Consideration, Give and Bestow to the Worshipful the Justices of the Court of Winton County for the Time being, and their Successors in Office, One Acre of Land on which the Prison, Stocks and Whipping Post are now erected & joining to the said John Mitchells two Acres given by a Deed of Gift to this County, the said Acre to be laid off in paralel Lines, untill the said Acre is fully measured & compleated. To have and to hold the said one Acre of Land to erect the said Publick Buildings thereon, & for no other Use or Purpose whatever. & the said Thomas Wylde for himself & his Heirs, & all other Persons claiming whatsoever with Warrant & hereby Defend the said one Acre of Land, to the Justices aforesaid & their Successors in Office, so long as the County Court of Winton shall be continued thereon and no longer. 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my Line & Will^m Robisons Line Just below the Prison, thence along the said Line in paralel Lines until the said two Acres are fully compleated & measured & also Timber sufficient to build a Court House thereon. To have & to hold the said two Acres of Land, to erect the said Publick Buildings thereon & for no other Purpose or Use whatever. & the said John Mitchell for himself & his Heirs and all persons claiming under him or them, shall other Persons whatsoever Will Warrant & hereby Defend the said two Acres of Land, to the Justices aforesaid & their Successors, so long as the County Court of Winton shall be continued thereon & no longer In Witness whereof, I have hereunto set my Hand & Seal this first Day of March 1789 & the thirtieth Year of the Independence of North America —
