Know all men by these presents that I William Dunbar of the County of Winton State aforesaid for and in consideration of the Sum of One hundred & Sixty five pounds Ten shillings Sterling Money to me in hand paid by George Robison of the State and County aforesaid at or before the sealing a delivery of these presents, the Receipt whereof I do hereby Acknowledge, have bargained & sold and by these presents do bargain Sell and Deliver unto the said George Robison a Negroe Wench named Rose, with her daughter Belinda and their future Issue, also all that Stock of Cattle marked with a Swallow fork and under Seal in one Ear ^{a crop} and over Slope in the other and Branded B.S. some Δ and some W.D. and perhaps some of them with some other Brand to have and to hold the said Negroe Wench Rose and her daughter Belinda with their future Issue and also all the aforesaid Stock of Cattle with their future increase unto the said George Robison his Executors, Administrator and Assigns to him and his only proper use and behoof forever. And I the said William Dunbar for myself my Heirs Executors &c all and singular the said Negroes and the said Stock of Cattle unto the said George Robison his Executors Administrators and Assigns against me the said William Dunbar and against all and every person whatsoever do warrant and forever defend by these presents.  greeting. Know ye that I the said Joseph Brooker for
 divers good causes and valuable consideration me hereunto
 moving have given and granted and by these presents do
 give grant and Confirm unto William Brooker the
 Son of John Brooker of the said County One Negroe -
 Woman named Tillies and her son called Frank
 Together with all her increase the Issue of her body
 either male or female unto the said William Brooker
 and his Lawful Heirs, begotten in holy Matlock, and
 the said William Brooker should at his decease have
 no children Lawfully begotten, then in such case the
 above Negroe Woman and all her increase shall return
 back to his Brothers and their Heirs after them and the
 said Negroe Woman and her increase is to remain
 in the possession of ^{the} Joseph Brooker peaceable during life
 And after the decease of I the Joseph Brooker, then
 the above Negroe peaceable and quietly to be put in posses-
 sion of the said William Brooker, and to remain in his
 and his Lawful Heirs forever. And the said William
 Brooker is not to bargain, sell or convey the said Negroe
 Woman or any of her increase whatever to any person
 or persons, but that the said property is Intacted from me
 after my death to said William Brooker and his
 rising Heirs from Age to Age. In Witness whereof I the
 said Joseph have hereunto set my hand and seal the
 28th day of September 1790.

I know all men by these presents that I Daniel Bourdeaux of Charleston Merchant for and in consideration of a Bond bearing even date with these presents wherein I the said Daniel Bourdeaux am held and firmly bound unto Esther Bourdeaux of St. Thomas's Parish in the Penal Sum of Four Thousand four Hundred Pounds Sterling Money conditioned for the payment of Two Thousand Two Hundred Pounds like Money on or before the Twenty sixth Day of January next ensuing with Interest from the Date of the said Bond as by the said receipted obligation and condition doth at large appear; and for the better securing the payment of the said sum of Two Thousand Two Hundred Pounds and Interest thereon as aforesaid, and also in consideration of the sum of five Pounds to me in hand paid by the said Esther Bourdeaux before the delivery of these presents, Have bargained sold and delivered, and by these presents in due form of Law do bargain sell and deliver unto the said Esther Bourdeaux the following Negro Slaves, to wit, Hager, Diana, Charlotte, Leah, Marlborough, Dick, Phillis, Big Juby, Little Juby, Little Leah; Also the moiety or half part undivided of Thirteen New Negroes, sent up to, and
