first I leave and bequeathe to my beloved Wife Elva one Megro Toman Named Poll and a Negro man named Ben for and during her lifetime I also leave and bequeathe unto her my beloved wife a Negro Girl named Minter to be at her own disposal I also leave and bequeathe to my beloved wife all my household and kitchen furniture, and Utensels except my house Clock my Side board & writing disk which alow to be disposed of as herein after directed I also leave and bequeathe unto my beloved wife of my stock four Cows & calves of her choice and my old horse Ball & a young mare named chance and my riding chair & Harnise Lalso leave and bequeathe to her my beloved wife two Hundred acres of Land of the tract of Land I now live on to be laid off in an advantegous way on the upper end of said tract including my dwelling house and any advantegous improvements thereto belonging Said Land I leave to my wife during her lifetime and I farther allow and bequeathe to my beloved wife the privelege of cutting and using timber on any of my land conveniant a sufficlency to keep up the improvements on the premisies which I leave her during her lifetime

Secondly I leave and bequeathe to my beloved Son Johnathan that Plantation or tract of Land known by McWoods old place that I bot of John Dunlap reserving however the privelege as afforesaid of cutting timber to keep up the improvements on my wifes premises

Thirdly I leave and bequeathe unto my beloved son william the one half of the plantation whereon he now lives including his improvements he now has made to be laid off on the side ad oining E Walstons Land and if it Should please God to bless him with children if he should have two heirs born to him that should live I allow him my said son to have the whole of said tract of Land and if it should please God to call him to death and he not leaving two heirs that should be born to him I allow the said other half of Said tract of Land to be sold & divided earl among the others of my children he my said son however to have full prigitege of cutting using timber of meadow Land etc. on any part of the Land during his life time I farther Leave and bequeathe unto my said son William a Negro boy Named Jacob

I farther Leave and bequeathe unto my said son William a Negro boy Named Jacob fourthly I leave and bequeathe unto my two sons Jerome and Abraham all the rest of my lands, on the Side of Taylors creek that I now live on equally to be divided between them my said two Sons making the run of the creek the line excepting however as much at the sawmill as will be a competency for a millyard and if it should so happen that they my said two sons could not agree in making the equal divide themselves of said Lands I would anominate and appoint my sons William and and my sons in Law Wm. Steel & Joseph Levers to to assest them in making an equal divide of the same according to quantity & quality and I do allow my Son Abraham to have the use of the Saw mill for one year after my decease

I farther allow my son Abraham to have the use of my waggon and team of Oxen during the time of Sawing for that Season that he is to have the use of the Saw mill I farther leave & bequeathe unto my said Son Abrm, a Negro Boy Named Rawley farther I leave & bequeath unto my son Jerome a Negro boy named Zachriah I farther Leave & bequeathe unto my said Son Abraham a Negro boy child named Daniel

McElwee a Negro Girl named Chaney and a Negro Girl Named Patience and I leave and bequeathe to my Daughter Betsey Steel a Negro Boy named David and I leave and bequeathe to my Daughter to my Daughter Jane Lewis a Negro Girl named Dilsey.

Sixthly All my other property not heretofore disposed of I do allow to be Sold and after my debts are paid I allow the moneys arising therefrom equally to be divided between all my children viz. Johnathan, Martha McElwee, Jane Lewis, Betsey-Steel William and Jerome and Abraham and at the Death of my Beloved Wife I allow the Land I left to her her lifetime and the two Negroes Poll & Ben and their increase to be Sold and equally to be divided between my children Martha McElwee Jane Lewis Betsey Stell, William Jerome and Abraham-----

Lastly-I do anominate and appoint my Son William and and my two Sons in law William Steel and Joseph Lewis to See this my Last Will and Testament duly Exicuted Signed Sealed published and acknowledged this thirteenth day of of September in the year of our Lord one Thousand eight Hundred and Twenty six and in the fifty first year of the Independency of the United States of America
