1st I will to my son John Scott a negro boy named Sam, and to his children as deed of gift sheweth Cinda & her three children.

2nd I will to my son James G. Scott a negro boy named Toney, and a negro boy named Willis, also a negro girl named Pattey.

3rd I will to my daughter Margaret Nesbit three negro girls named Lucy Lavinia & Matilda also a negro boy named Bill.

4th I will to my daughter Nancy Boyes the following Sarah, Nelly, Ive, Adaline, & Peter.

5th I will that the following negroes Isom, Jordan, Dizey & her five children, & Joshua, be valued moderately, and that my son John Scott take Isom at the valuation, and my son James G Scott take Joshua at the valuation and that my daughters Margaret

Nesbit & Nancy Boyes take Dizey and her five children and Jordan, leaving it discretionary with Dizey with whom she will live.--

I will also that my negro man Lenon have a support on this plantation.

6th I will that the plantation on which I live including the Davis tract be valued at a very moderate valuation, and that some one of the legatees take it at the valuation-- I will also that all my other property such as stock and Household furniture be also valued moderately and that the legatees take it at the valuation But should it be thought more expedient to expose to sale property which might be thought redundant, my Executor is at

liberty to do so.

7th I will that after the payment of my just debts all my property thus valued and sold including every thing connected with my Estate be divided equally among my four Legatees.

8th I will and appoint my son in law Alexander Nesbit the Executor of this my last will and Testament--In witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this 18th day November 1836
