1st my will is that all my lawfull debts be paid out of my estate

2nd I give and bequeath to Mary, my loving wife all my estate both real and personel, not otherwise here after willed--During her widdhood to be at her desposuel, and at her Death, or maredg to be equally Devided a monget her chilidren, that she has before my death---

3/ I will to my Son John Jenkins five Dollars

4/ I will to my daughter Martha Hamelton eighteen Dollars

5/ I will to my son Benjamin Jenkens one hundred acres of land off the upper end of my plantation above the waggon Road, if he chuses to Settle on it

6/ I will to my son David Mitchel Jenkens to have fifty Dollars out of my estate to stay on the plantetation two years & have Six months Schooling and then to be put to a trade

7/ I will my Doughters Margret Jenkens one bead and furneter, and four head of cowbeast that She know clam and the coalt that the Sorel mare is with know

And I appoint My wife Mary Jenkens Executrix John McElwee Sener
& Wm. McGill executers of this my Last will, and testament, and
I do hereby utterly disallow, Revoke and disannul all and everey
other former wills testements Legacies bequests, and Executors
by me ~~in any wise~~ before named willed and bequeathed R. ticing
and confirming this, and, no other to be my last will and, no
