4thly. I leave & bequeath to the rest of my beloved children Viz My beloved Sons Thomas Alexander William and Samuel and my belov'd Daughters Rosannah Brown & Mary Stillman and Elizabeth Campbell and Quincey Campbell all the remainder of my Land to be divided among them equally but and if the

should think it not best to divide the Land I allow some one

or more of them to take it and pay the others a fair price. for their parts or if they think it more advisable to sell it and divide the price of it equally among them 5thly 'I leave & bequeath to my daughter Kosanna a good Womans Saddle which I allow my son John to purchase for her out of the property of Stock ect I have left him 6thly I leave & bequeath to my two beloved describers Eliza abeth & Quincy Campbell each their living in the dwelling house with their boarding & priviledge to work for themselves as heretofore until they either marry or thrugh choice wish to remove at which time I leave & bequeath to each of them their claims of bedding and other furniture in the house that they have worked for and earned and further I leave and bequeath to each of them a good Cow & Cali which I allow my son John to give them out of the stock that I have left him Lastly I will and constitute my beloved Sons John Campbell and William Campbell my Executors to see that my last Will and Testament faerly executed agreeable to the truemeaning thereof In witness whereof I hereunto set my hand an Sealthis first day of August in the year of our Lord one Thousand eight Hundred & twenty one & in the forty sixth year of the Independence of the United States of America
