Item I give and Bequeath to my Wife Margret McClenahan the whole of my Estate both real & personal during her life and at Her Death to dispose of my personal Estate as she may think proper, but my real Estate after my Wifes Death to be Equally Devided between my two Sons James & John McClenahan to be theirs forever, And where as no Devision of the real Estates which Decended to me & my Brother John McClenahan from our Father Robert McClenahan has yet taken place, I do hereby Authorise & empower my said Wife Margret to make the said Devision and to Execute such Titles to my said Brother as will make the said Devision Complete and I do also Authorise my said Wife to convey to my said Brother all the land I have Leased from the Cataba Indians uper or East side of the Ten Miles-Creek. & Bounding on the Cataba River hereby Confirming whatsoever my said wife may do in the said Devision in as full & ample a maner as if my self had done it.

Lastly. I do Hereby appoent & ordain my Brother John McClenahan Executor of this my last Will & Testament
