Children Viz Five of them George Pettus Rebakah W. Pettus,
Sarah Pettus Sinthay Pettus Susanna Pettus--my son George
Pettus is to have Six Hundred Dollars more in the devision
then the Fore Girls a bove mensioned I also leave unto
my sade wife all my Houshold Furniture & movables what-
soever with the halfe of the Cattle Hogs Hoses Sheeps
& all the Gees 3 I also leave unto my son John D.O.K.
Pettus one Hundred Dollars 4 I also leave unto my Daughter
Ann D. Pettus now Clauson Jule Rose her Chile one Bead
& Covering to her & the Eirs of her body one gray mare
named Molvow which she got all. 5 I also leave unto my
Son Stephen Pettus one Hundred Dollars one bead & Covering
6 I also leave unto my Daughter Mary Pettus now Called
Burton Negro Girl Named Jud & Horse Saddle & bed & Cover-
ing to her & the Ears of hir body which she has got 7
I also leave unto my daughter Jane Pettus now Colled
Gudreds a Negro Girl Corled Luce & man Named Slick Badde

she has got--8 I also leave unto my daughter Elizebeth
Pettus & Negro Girl named Suf & Horse Saddle & bed & Cov-
ering to her & the Ears of hir body her name is olted to
Harres & she has all but the Horse Saddle to be Valuted to
Fifty Dollars 9 I also leave unto my daughter Rabakah
W. Pettus a Negro boy named Ellick & Horse Saddle & bridle
to be Valued to Sevety Dollars & bed & Covering to hir &
the Ears of hir body 10 I leave unto my daughter Sarah
Pettus a negro boy named bob a Horse Saddle & Bridle to be
Valued to Seventy dollars & bed & Covering to hir & the
Ears of hir boddy 11 I also leave unto my Son George
Pettus Two Negroes Named Day & Mose & Horse Saddle &
bridle to be Valued to one Hundred Dollars & bed & Cover-
ing & the Home Hous the Land belonging to it as fare as the
branch that leads down this side of where uncle Dillard
lived by the spring that uncle made yuse of & that branch
is to be the line inclusing the Gle plase 12 I also
leave unto my daughter Sintha Pettus & Negro Girl named
lile & horse saddle & bridle to be Valued to Seventy
Dollars & bed & Covering to hir & the Ears of hir body
13 I leave also unto my daughter Susanna Pettus a Negro
Girl named dianna & Horse & Saddle & bridle to be valued
to sevety Dollars & bed & Covering to hir & the Ears of
hir body 14 I leave all lands & tennaments waggin & teame
& michene to my beloved wife during hir widowhood that
after hir death to be lefte to my sons my son George Pettus
to have the home Hous & to the branch above mensioned 15
the upper peace & that little peace over the Creek the
East side is to be Eaqually divided betwen John D.O.K.
Pettus & StepenPettus John to have the upper & stepen
next to the Creek 16 I also leave Ben to be solde &
devided betwen my fore Derters Ann Clossen Mary Burton Jane
Gulrdge Elizebeth Harres

Pettus my son my Sole Executers to see this my last Will
& Testament duly Executed & perform'd In Witness whereof
I have heare unto set my hand & Seale this 26 of July in
the Yeare of our Lord 1816
