

The State of South Carolina

In the name of God, Amen I Guzzell McCall of Yorkville in the State aforesaid being of Sound and disposing mind and memory and desirous of disposing of my wordly estate do make and ordain following as my last will and testament to wit:

Imprimis: It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid out of the proceedsof my property not herein specifically bequeathed

Secondly. To my Son Hilleriah McCall I give and bequeath my negro woman named Cindah to him and his heirs Exors & Admrs. forever.

Thirdly. To my Son Alfred McCall I give and bequeath my negro boy child (son of Cindah) named John to him his heirs exers. admrs & assigns forever.

Fourthly. To my grand Daughter Lucinda McCall I give and bequeath the bed and furniture known as that once belonging to her aunt Lucinda for whom she was named

Fifthly To my Son Alfred I give and bequeath the bed and furniture he now uses. Sixthly: It is my Will & desire that all the rest of my estate both real & personal shall be sold by my executors at such time and on such terms as they may deem meet. and the proceeds thereof together with any future increase whcih Cindah may have between this and my death, and any cash on hand or choses in action after the payment of my debts funeral expenses & expensesof administration, shall be equally divided among my three sons Alfred, Hilleriah and John

Seventhly: I do hereby nominate and appoint my sons Hilleriah and John McCall executors of this my last will and testament.
