

The last will and Testament of Hugh Walker of the District of
York and State of South Carolina Considering the uncertainty
of this mortal life and being of Sound mind and memory Blessed
be God for the same do make and publish this my last will and
testament in manner and form following that is to say first I
give to my daughter Sarah and my Daughter Martha and my Son
Andrew five Shillings each 2d I give and devise to my daughter
Margreat the one half of my plantation to her and her heirs and
assigns forever provided she pays fifty Dollars to Mary Ann my
grand Daughter within the terme of Twelve months from my decease
the land lying along John Reineys Side of the plantation 3rd I
give Devise and bequeath to my grand Daughter Mary Ann the other
half to her and her heirs or assigns for ever of the plantation
lying next Gillifilling including the house and kitching and Bearn
together with all the personal property which I am possessor of She
paying all my Just Debts and funiral Expenses She is to take care
of Martha and Andrew my Daughter and Son She is to Receive the
half of the Cleane Wheate and the Third of the Corn madeon the
place for the year 1838 as Rent from John McClain Margreat not to
Come into possession untill one year after my decease of the above
named land. I hereby leve John Ingram and John McClain Executors
of this my last will and testament hereby Revoking all former wills
by me made in witness whereof I have hereunto Set my hand and seal
this 11th Day of February 1838.
