I Hugh White Citizen of the State of So. Carolina and York Dist.
being in health of Body and Sound in Mind and of a disposing Mem-
ory, and Calling to mind that it is appointed for all Man Kind
onde to die---And with respect to the worldly Estate that I have
been blessed with I design it to be disposed of as follows--
First I will that my body be Burried in a decent Christian form
at the diseration of my Executors---Secondly I will and order that
all my just debts be first and duly paid by my Executors out of
my Estate before any divisions takes place or any Items be deliv-
ered to any Legatees, and then I will and order that my Indian
Lease whereon I now live be Kept and Divided so that my three
sons Jos. F. White George P White and Hugh M White will each one
get an equal part of the low grounds on the Riber and a part of
the High-lands on the Hill in equal Value allowing the Dwelling
House to be in the Middle tract and that my son H Monroe White,
be allowed to take the Middle tract, and that my Beloved wife Sarah
White, do remain in my dwelling House during her widowhood or
natural life and I do lone to her three of my Negroes (Viz)
Milly John and Creasy for the time before said; and if she moves
from my dwelling House the negroes are not to be taken by her or
any other person for her out of this State and district; and at
her death and Otherways the sd Negroes are all to be returned with
the natural Increase of their body (if any) and to be equally div-
ided between my three Sons already named by appraisement of three
judicious men of their own Choosing --
And those negroes above named and Issue (if any) are to be loned
to my sons in the same manner as the rest of my will be in the

following Items.-----

My daughter Elizabeth Russel Campbell I lene to her five of my negroes during her natural life (that is to Say) Amy Jacob, Rabb or Bob, Anny, and Patty.-----

And before or at her death I will that She (if any Issue) from her own Body Survive her) that She allott those Negroes and their Issue if any; to her children as She Sees proper ; and all the furniture of the household and Kitchen that I have given her or may hereafter give her, and they Stock ect.--

I consider it her full division of my Estate, and if She dies without any living Issue from her own body then the above said Negroes & their Issue of their Bodies to return to my Children or if my Children are dead and left lawfull issue their Child or Children (as the case may be) to take the division as their father would have taken if living.-----My fifth part of the Indian lease Called the Green Pond is to be Sold and the proceeds of it applied to the maintainance of my Son James and my fifth part of Simon is to be sold and applied to the Same use duering his natural life and there is to be as much more as will make up One hundred Dollars each and every year to the one that Keeps and takes care; feeds and Cloaths him with the Sales of those two articles above mentioned.-- That Amount is to be raised and leveled out of my Estate for him before and Legacys can be taken

other ways.---- Thirdly All they remainder of my Negroes not here in before named that I may die in possession of; I lend to my three Sons (already named) in family lotts, by appraisement of the same three judicious men as are already mentioned; to them during their Natural life; (and their Increase likewise) and I will & allow my Sons at any time in their life time or at their

death to allott out those negroes and their increase (if any) to
their Children in Such lotts as they may think proper.--- Take
notice those families of negroes are to be made as equal as pos-
sible by the appraisen; and if not alltogether equal in Value then
they are to Cast lotts who such a family will fall to, andthem or
him who gets the least Value is to receive an equal Value of
some other property.-----All my other property is to be sold at
public Sale and Divided equally amongs my three sons before Said.
Mark- well if any of my Sons should die before or have no living
Issue of their own body then my negroes that I do lone to them
must return to my other Sons that living and if not, their Chil-
dren, and the Increase of the negroes likewise And fourthly and
lastly; I do hereby Constitute and appoint my beloved Sons George
P White, Joseph F White, and Hugh M White Executors of this my
last will and Testament and do hereby pronounce this to be my
last; and do by these presents disannul renouene and forever for
bid, any will heretofore by me made, to be Virtual hereafter.-----
Signed Sealed and pronounced this 25th day of July in the year of
our Lord one thousand eight hundred & Twenty five and in the fif-
tieth year of the Independency of the United States of America.--
