I also will unto my beloved wife Martha the stock of Cattle, horses, sheep, hogs &c that Is mine at my decease to be hers during life & at her decease, to be the property of my two daughters before mentioned, equally Likewise the third of of the land I now leave to my wife Martha at her decease, to belong to the same two Girls Anne & Jane equally, so long as they continue to live single--& if one of them should marry the other is to have it all during life except she marries & if they both many ound able apacheers net

marry I allow it to them during life; & at their decease I allow said land together with the remainder of my land to belong to & be the property of my son James -- Likewise my farming.

Utensils I allow to be divided Between my son James & my daughters Anne & Jame. so as to enable them to carry on separate farms if they do not see property to work together to be divided (if they cannot agree) by my Executors

I also will and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Henry one Book

daughter Martha Niel one Book entitled Pikes Cases of Conscience Likewise my daughter Margaret McElwee one Back antitled Fisher Catechism Also my daughter Elizabeth & Erskine on the shorter one book entitled Marshalls Gospel Mystery of Sanctification Also my son Hames the Confession of faith & my other books to my wife & two first mentioned daughters as a family --I also Constitute make and ordain my beloved wife Martha & my son James to be the Executrix & Executor of this my last will and Testament and I do hereby Utterly disannull, all and every other fourmer Testaments, wills, legacies bequests & Executors, by me before in any wise before named, willed and bequeathed; ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this thirt centh day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight nundred & Eighteen & in the forty second & forty third year of american In-
