1st I will to my well beloved wife Jane a Negro Girl named  
Kisiah with all her offspring, and all the female offspring of  
Jude, also one Horse saddle & Bridle and riding Chare to be al-  
way kept up in repare for her use. together with all the House-  
hold furniture that she brought with her here, and such as she  
may have made afterward, to be wholly at her disposal forever--  
Also during her life or widowhood I allow her the full and free  
possession of my due dwelling house, and all other buildings  
necessary for her comfortable accomadation and suport, and  
for the suporting & providing for my Children by her. I will  
that my Negroes that are not otherwise gifted, and all my stock,  
and farming tools of every Discription be kept for the benefit  
of the family. Except such Negroes, or other things as the Exe-  
cutors shall think best to sell or hier

2nd Next I will to my son Eleazar a part of the tract of Land  
known by the name of the Carter tract lying on the South Side of  
the Thorn Ferry road. Receiving this Legacy. I Consider him to  
have received all that Legacy that was due to him by his Uncle  
John Hunter due out of my Estate

3d Next I will to my Son Henry the one half of the tract of Land  
whereon I now liv at my wifes death or Marriage--also a 1st and a  
6th Choice of my Negroes also a Horse Saddle and Bridle when he  
arrives at the age of 21 years of age, together with my secretary  
& Bookcase, also half of my plantation which I bought from Eleaz.

4th Next I Will to my Son Robert Hearvy the one half of the Tract of Land whereon I now live at my wifes death or Marriage, also a 2nd and a fifth Choice of my Negroes. Also a Horse and saddle & Bridl when he arrives at the age of 20 years, together with my Clock and Walnut Beuro & Bookcase also half of the Tract of Land purchased from Eleazar 5th Next I Will to my Daughter Martha Jane a 3d and a 4th Choice of my Negroes not otherwise named, also a Horse saddle & Bridle when she arrives at the age of 20 years or Marriage, also my Mahogany Bureau & small Burch Table and a well furnished Bed & Bedsted also my Lease and Interist in my Gold mine-- 6th Next I Will all my Books to be Equally divided between my Wifee and my Children Except Eleazar who has Received his part, also that my Son Johns Children Receive one Share 7th Next I will to my Grandauter Nancy Harris one Negro girl named Phebe. 8th Next I will that at my Wifes Decease or Marriage that all my Negroes not taken by Choice or Sold be Equally divided between my Sons Eleaz. (if he has Legal offspring) John Hunters Sons one Share, Henry Robert Harvy and Martha Jane--9th Next I will that all my farming utesils Household furniture and Kitchen and Cupboard wares together with every thing not named in the above Will which to me belongeth, be Equally divided between Henry Robert Hearvy and Martha Jane any article given by my Wifee to my children before this division is not to be recalled or brought into this division 10th Next I Will that in case any Misunderstanding or Contention should arise about my Estate or any thing Contained in my Will, that an application shall be made to the Ordenary for his opinion on the case, and if it should not satisfy the parties he shall call 2 or more disinterested persons and they shall give their Verdict in writing which shall be final--and if any of the Legatees Co shyskD premis 160 carry it further into
