of my Dwelling house and out houses so much cleared Land as may
be necessary for her to cultivate for her support and support
of her negroes and stock, and sufficient timber for the repairs
of her houses and fences, fire wood etc., and after ^{her death} all such pro-
perty as is not herein after named to be equally divided between
my daughter Margaret Bell and my son Jno Black according to the
appraised value of the same

3rd To my Daughter Margaret Bell, I give and bequeath my ne-
gro boys Stephen & Sam, my metal clock falling leaf Table and side
board, a set of China ware and the side board furniture.

4th To my Daughter Jane Vickers I give devise and bequath the
tract of land where on william Vickers now reside, which was con-
veyed to me by Mathew Fondren and also a small tract conveyed to
me by Zackaria Bates, I also give to my daughter Jane my negro
girl Patience and my old riding chair and harness

5th To my son David Leroy Black I give and bequeath my negro
boy George but the said George is remain in possession of my wife
Elenor for her use during her natural life

6th To my son John Black I will and bequath my negro boy Adam
and my negro boy Charles my waggon, Black smith tools, Cotton
gin Cotton Schrew and thresher with the houses they are in, I
also give to my son Jno. at the death of my wife Elenor, the plan-

ation whereon I now reside, reserving however for the use
of my daughter Margarette Bell the occupation of the house
wherein I now reside, during her natural life or widowhood
7th To my Granddaughter Mary Bell I will and bequeath my
negro girl Delphy this bequest is to be understood as payment
in full for a debt I owe the Estate of Joshua D. Bell dec'd
