to bless me with, do make and ordain this my last will, in man-
ner following, that is to say:

First, I give & bequeath unto my wife Margaret Johnston all my
household and Kitchen furniture & one year's provision also, my
old gray mare, Also I direct that the remainder of my personal
property of what kind soever be sold at public auction, and that
all my Just debts be paid out of the monies arising therefrom.
It is also my request that my land or real estate be Sold by my
Executor & Executrix either at public or private Sale as they
Shall deem most convenient & profitable, and at what time so-
ever they may think most advantageous.

It is also my wish that when my land Shall be Sold, that a small
farm be purchased for my family to live on, which farm at the
death of my wife shall be sold, & the proceeds equally divided
between my Children. I further order that all monies arising
out of my estate after my debts and other expenses are paid to
be equally divided between My wife and children, the children's
money to be kept at interest untill they shall arrive to the age
of twenty-one years, or marries a man of that age, each child
to be schooled out of its own money--

And lastly, I do constitute and appoint my said wife executrix,
and My friend Andrew McConnel executor of this my last will &
testament by me heretofore made. In testimony whereof I have
