Itam I also will and bequeath to my sun Stephen Pettus the plantat-
ion I now live on and a negrow boy boy Named Eleck-----
Itam--I also bequeath to my Daughter Hannah mary Amanda two
girls each and mary and Also a bed and muriture--and a horse Sadle
and bridle worth one hundred Dollars-----
Itam I also allow mill and ealse to be sold and Equaley Divided
Betwen the two Children and my wife and also the uper plantation is
to be sold to pay my debts to the best advantage I also leave my wi-
to be an Exekertruks--this is my last will and Testament World
Without End Amen.
