In the Name of God Amen I John Moore being of sound and disposing mind and memory, but weak in body and cauling to mind the uncertainty of life, and being desirous to dispose of all Such worldly affairs as it hath pleased god to bless me with, do make and ordain this my last will, in the manner following---
 First I recommend my soul to god & my body to the earth to buried in a decent manner Secondly I give & bequeath to Rachel coulter & to her children.

Sixty Acres of land it being the upper part of the land I now live on which must include the house & spring.

I also give Rachel coulter & to her children the rent of which I am to get of James McConnel & I also give to the sd. Rachel Coulter & to her children or child a negro boy named more.

Thirdly I give & bequeath to my brother James Moore my sorrel horse my pesnt crop which is about the house corn cotton wheat & oats, the wheat I get from McConnel for rent I allow for

Rachel. My Negro boy Sam must attend to the crop untill it is gathered Fourthly I will & bequeath my boy Sam to John Alex.

Moore, when he arrives at the age of twenty one in the mean time Sam is to be hired out to some good master, after the present crop is gathered,---& further I will and bequeath to John Alexd, Moore the allance or lower part of my land which is Suposed to be about eighty Acres more or less-----

Fifthly I allow my brother James Moore in consideration of what I have bequeathed to him to pay my funeral expenses & all my debts.-----

And lastly I constitute James Moore Junior my executor of this
my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have here-
unto set my hand & affixed my Seal this Seventh day of May
1831
