Boy Gilly

6th I will and bequath unto My Daughters Martha Glenn, Polly
Duff Elisabeth Bryson & Margaret Anderson, and Equale dividend
of all My household & Kitchen furniture, together with My waring
Apperall, with the Exception of one black Silk Shawle, to My
Daughter in law Polly Craig

7th I will and Direct that all Grain Growing or Collected to-
gether with forrage at the time of My Discease Shall be Equally
